DEXTER TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NUMBER 17

ADOPTED: JULY 1, 1986

EFFECTIVE: AUGUST 8, 1986

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE STANDARDS FOR POLICE OFFICER TRAINING AND TO ALLOW THE TOWNSHIP TO LIMIT APPLICATION OF TRAFFIC AND PARKING ORDINANCES AND TO ACCEPT CONTRIBUTIONS FROM REPRESENTATIVES OF PLATTED LANDS NOT DEDICATED TO PUBLIC USE TO DEFRAY ADMINISTRATIVE AND ENFORCMENT COSTS INCIDENT TO THE ENACTMENT OF ORDINANCES.

THE TOWNSHIP OF DEXTER ORDAINS:

SECTION I

1. The township board may, adopt ordinances regulating the public health, safety and general welfare of persons and property, fire protection, the licensing or use of bicycles, traffic and parking of vehicles, sidewalk maintenance and repairs, licensing regulation of hawkers, vendors, peddlers, solicitors, circuses, carnivals and public amusements, provide penalties for the violation thereof, shall enforce the same and may for that purpose employ and establish a police department with full power and authority to enforce all local township ordinances and state laws, provided in the event such state laws are to be enforced, a law enforcement unit whose officers training complies with the law enforcement officers training act, Public Act 203 of 1965, as amended, shall be established. Special township deputies appointed by the Washtenaw County sheriff shall be under the jurisdiction of and solely responsible to the sheriff.

SECTION II

1. Ordinances so enacted may apply to the streets, roads, highways, or portions of the township as shall be determined by the board, or may be limited to specified platted lands within the township, and with respect thereto shall be valid and enforceable whether the roads and streets therein have been dedicated to public use or not. The Township board may accept contributions from duly constituted representatives of the platted lands benefited by such ordinances, to defray all administrative and enforcement costs incident to the enactment of ordinances.

SECTION III

1. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

1.	This Ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days from adoption and publication.
