MULTI LAKE SEWER WATER AUTHORITY:

MLSWA is currently developing bids for Dexter Township to replace pumps at Copper Meadows and Silver Lake Associations. Earlier this year the Board of Trustee's authorized an expenditure of \$70,000 from the American Rescue Plan Funds to improve our aging capital equipment. Maintenance on our wastewater treatment plant is constantly in need. Please remember to NOT flush rags, wipes, grease or other materials into the sewer system and grinder pumps. When in doubt, please don't. Attached is an article for your review to gain a greater understanding or the effects this has on our sewer system. Thank you.

DEXTER TOWNSHIP ROADS:

At Aprils Board of Trustee meeting, the vote was taken to approve the 2022-23 budget for road improvement. The contract with Washtenaw County Road Commission has been signed and work is earmarked to begin this year. Additionally, approval was given to develop a road improvement committee. We currently have 8 volunteers interested in joining this committee, to help move our road projects forward through quarterly meetings. DEXTER TOWNSHIP MASTER PLAN:

The Master Plan Steering Committee continues to move forward. A full survey questionnaire is underdevelopment and will be sent to residents to gain insights to the

stance of our community members. Existing land use, discussion on land preservation, demographics, single hauler trash and more will be included in this survey.

EXECUTIVE BOARD MEMBERS SALARIES:

Pay raises for executive board member positions were discussed and approved at the April Board of Trustees meeting. Annual salaries of \$37,140 were increased to \$38,254 for the Supervisor, Clerk and Treasurer positions, allowing for a 3% increase. Additional conversations were had regarding completing a competitive salary wage study to be able to attract future residents to become involved. Should salary adjustments for board member positions be warranted, the increases would take effect following the 2024 election cycle. Since nothing will change until after the 2024 election cycle, this topic will be discussed in greater detail in upcoming months.
